

Mill St. rail crossing gets overdue repairs

A letter from the Mayor to Metrolinx Chair Robert Prichard last week sparked some action resulting in the Mill St. rail crossing finally being repaired.

Mayor Rick Bonnette sent the letter Jan 15 after complaining at last Monday's council meeting about the poor repair job Goderich Exeter Rail Line (GEXR) and Metrolinx did at the crossing and the fact they hadn't come back to fix it despite repeated calls from Town staff.

He requested in the letter dated Jan. 15 the work be done expeditiously.

It appears the letter worked, because after waiting for months the work was completed by PNR Railworks on behalf of GO Transit Tuesday.

"This crossing was rehabbed last October, but left a large "hump" for vehicular traffic to drive over," said Wesley Logan. General Manager of GEXR.

"The reason why it took so long to address this problem was due to GEXR's concern of reconciling the interests of all the stakeholders involved," said Logan.

"Go Transit is the new owner of this infrastructure, the repair affects both the train and traffic signal system, so it needed to be in accordance with Go Transit's future expansion plans (which are in the early stages of being developed) and not to cause undue traffic congestion," Logan said.

"The repairs were overdue but I am pleased to see the quick action as a result of my correspondence," said Bonnette. "The people of Acton and the commuters will be very relieved to see this work completed."
