Inglis announces Town Public Arts Policy at Symposium

"The theme of this year's Symposium is 'Helping culture grow,' and from a Town perspective we are focused on long-term plans," said Councillor Bob Inglis, who brought greetings from the Town of Halton Hills. He said local arts, culture and heritage will be major factors on how the new urban expansion— Vision Georgetown— would be developed. The Town is also working on a full implementation and costing plan of the award-winning Halton Hills Cultural Master Plan (which the Roundtable helped produce). Inglis said that Plan would get Council consideration sometime in the next month or two.

"Town staff will also be bringing forward a Public Arts Policy, and that policy will be detailing funding models for including art in municipal capital projects," said Inglis.

Individual musical performances by Acton High School's Grade 11 students Hannah Ward and Aaron Jones were a highlight on Friday night. Their poise and musicality were remarkable and served as a reminder of the brilliant talent of our local youth.

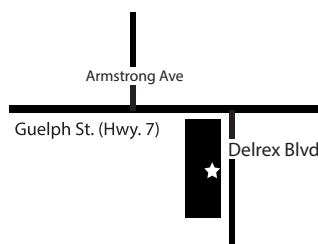
