
**PHENOM VISITS CTK Stjepan Curic** (24) of Christ the King's Jaguars had the unenviable task of trying to cover Corpus Christi's 6-foot-8 sensation Simisalo ('Simi') Shittu (11) during a Halton Secondary School Athletic Association senior boys' AAAA basketball contest Tuesday afternoon in Georgetown. Shittu is considered the top Canadian high school basketball prospect by NCAA Division I colleges and he's actually still only a junior by age, a Grade 10 student who just turned 15 two months ago. Curic held Shittu to nine first-half points and dropped in a couple of baskets himself, but the 9-0 Longhorns rolled to a comfortable victory over the winless Jaguars. In Tuesday's junior matchup, CtK upped its mark to 6-4 after a 41-36 triumph over the Longhorns in the Tier I loop. The Georgetown Rebels returned from the exam break Tuesday with a 68-36 home loss to Milton's Bishop Reding Royals and are now 4-7 in the HSSAA Tier I senior standings, with another contest at home Thursday against Jean Vanier S.S. at 3:30 p.m.

## **Raiders clinch conference**

Anthony Marra tallied twice, including the winner on the power play 27 seconds into overtime, as the Georgetown Raiders defeated the visiting Buffalo Jr. Sabres 3-2 Saturday evening at the Alcott Arena.

The victory clinched the Ontario Junior Hockey League's South/ West Conference championship for the 32-5-3-5 Raiders, who still have nine regular season games to play over the final two weeks of the campaign and have won six straight starts.

Defenceman Eric Eustace added a shorthanded marker in the second period for Georgetown that evened the score at two. The Raiders outshot the Ir. Sabres 31-23 and rookie netminder Jack La-Fontaine earned the win in goal to improve to 18-4-0 in 2014-15.

Next up for the Raiders is a home date with the 34-11-1-3 Cobourg Cougars Saturday at the Alcott Arena beginning at 7:30 p.m.

Georgetown holds a 13-point lead over the South Division-leading Toronto Patriots and a 25-point advantage over the Orangeville Flyers in the West Division tables.

Raider head coach & GM Greg Walters said it shouldn't be a problem keeping his players interested and focused over the next few essentially meaningless games.
