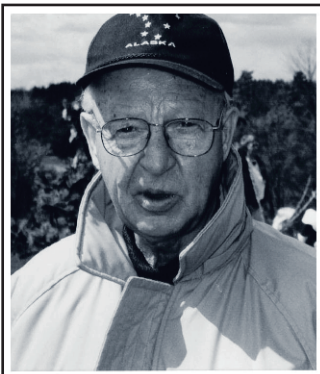
### BROWN, Gregory Allan "Greg"
