- Georgetown Cruise Nights (accepted by Mike & Lynn Boyd) — For more than 15 years, the weekly Thursday night gathering of Classic Car enthusiasts has raised approximately \$35,000 through sponsors, 50/50 draws and sales of pizza slices.
- The Lambert Family Christmas display on Johnson Cres. (presented to Kathy & Darryl Lambert) is about to celebrate its seventh year, consisting of more than 45,000 lights and close to \$50,000 raised for

the foundation in part through donations from the public.

- Georgetown Hospital Volunteer Assoc. (received by Marie Carney) has held many bake sales, raffles, quilt draws and poinsettia sales to support the foundation.
- Cathy Ireland The leader of Team RBC for the Walk or Run for Georgetown Hospital, she hosts the annual In Memory of Chris Ireland Golf Tournament foundation fundraiser in tribute to her son.
