




A Dominion Seed House Christmas

Based out of a mock-Tudor building constructed in 1936, this photo shows Dominion Seed House lit up for Christmas in 1963. Sold to a Quebec company in 1993, the building was demolished in 1999, with the stone walls of the sunken garden all that remain of what was a Georgetown and Canadian gardening institution. Light up the Hills now celebrates the season at Dominion Gardens Park, named in honour of this iconic business.
