The camp also involved a dry-land component and self-confidence-building sessions. Marzo added that in order to accommodate the camp,

the Acton Arena opened two weeks earlier than usual.

"Nathan has done a wonderful job organizing this," Trottier said. "He and his dad Phil and wife Victoria have been able to get so much local support with volunteers and sponsorships and it's great to work with such enthusiastic kids here in Acton."

More than 150 of the best road racers in Ontario are expected to ride in the 112-km Tour de Terra Cotta cycling event this Saturday beginning at 10 a.m.

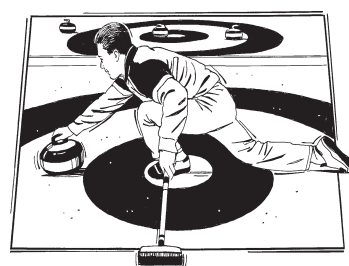
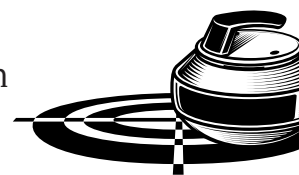
