Acton sweeps C of C Business Achievement Awards

MacMillan's win as Business of the Year made it a clean sweep for Acton at the 26th annual Chamber of Commerce business achievement awards dinner on Friday at the North Halton Golf Club.

With tears in her eyes and her youngest son by her side, Lynda Martin, who with husband Roy owns MacMillan's Gourmet Frozen Foods, accepted the top honour for 2005, joining two other Acton women – Marie Vickery, the Employee of the Year, and Kristine Cieslok, Entrepreneur of the Year – as part of a smart and savvy troika of Acton women.

MacMillan's, the frozen food emporium located on Highway 7 just west of Acton, is known for its unflagging support of the community and superb customer service.

It was selected from three finalists announced last month, including the Halton Hills Speech Centre and Vision 2000 Travel Group.

lan's for the award noted it is involved with fundraisers for local churches and schools, the Acton food bank, school breakfast programs, the Acton Fireman's Ball and sponsors many local sports teams.


Accepting her awards for Employee of the Year, Acton librarian Marie Vickery said she was out of her element at a black tie affair - her audience was usually sitting in a circle, at knee height - and to please forgive her if she forgot where she was and admonished them to stop fidgeting.

She said until this Chamber award, the rewards of a job well done have been a big hug, a crayon likeness of herself or a bouquet of dandelions.

"I was just lucky enough to find a job that I love. One which allows me to tell stories, sing songs and create a place of imagination for the children of Halton Hills," Vickery said, adding she wants to share the award with her fellow staffers.

Acton's Blue Springs Spa owner Kristine Cieslok thanked her mother and step-father for travelling from California to help her celebrate, and her husband Jorge, for helping her build her "dream castle spa" in 2003 – her
