scores – we're still struggling with that – so it will continue to be a focus so we can improve our instruction to ensure that our students are successful," he said, adding that they are also looking at curriculum mapping to make sure there is seamless learning between one grade and the next.

In response to on-going concerns about safety and parking at Robert Little, work is now complete on the sidewalk at the front of the school and parking area at the rear of the school. Tadman said additional parking is now available on School Lane, the cement block sidewalk that had been heaving was removed and the area black topped at the front of the school, and a student pick-up/drop-off zone has been created at the rear of the school.

Robert Little, with 365 students, has a total staff complement of 35 people including newcomers:

- Ken Mak who will teach a new Grade 2/3 French Immersion class
- Susan Milne, a SERT (Special Education Resource Teacher) who is a maternity leave replacement for Michelle Mattocks.
- Jennifer Wedgewood who will cover a maternity leave for Grade 2 teacher Kristen Parker until December.
- Marianne Regis, filling a new part-time staff position providing primary and junior coverage, and,
- Sharon Foster, a retired Literacy Resource Teacher, who will spend half her time as a SERT and the other half in the Kindergarten.

MSB school

At McKenzie-Smith Bennett School, students will be greeted on Tuesday with fresh paint, some new staff and an emphasis on character education, described by Principal Sharon French as a program to encourage good citizenship and developing character.

"Last year we started using a book called The School of Belonging in our home base program and started using something called collaborative problem solving and we saw a huge decrease in discipline situations. Our suspension rate went way down and we were able to solve a lot of issues just by being proactive and building a better character program," French said on Monday.

French said they are geared up for Tuesday because the first day is the most important day of the year.

"Getting kids off to a successful start is so important, so we are really focussing on making kids feel welcome, making kids feel safe and that they belong and really placing the focus on good character development and academic achievement."

Acton High School

At Acton District High School Principal Bert O'Hearn said they would continue with literacy and numeracy iniatives.

The school is also offering several new programs this year, including a specialist high skills major in communications technology that will be taught by Wade Stark.

"This program can appeal to a number of kids across a broad range because there is a pathway for students going right to work as well as to college or university. It's a broad program that will appeal to students who are interested in any aspect of media/communications technology," O'Hearn said on Tuesday.

- We are looking for people who live in an older home who suspect they have a lead service connection or lead in their home's plumbing. (Homes built before 1952 may have lead service connections or internal lead plumbing, and homes built before 1990 may have lead solder connecting copper pipes.)
- Halton staff will require access to your property to collect a sample. Testing is free and the results will be shared with you.
