Georgetown woman, 53, dies after Crewson Corners crash

A 53-year-old Georgetown woman, Debra McKnight, died as the result of a two car collision on Highway 7 at Crewson Corners, just west of Acton on Saturday night, Sept 19, at about 11 o'clock.

Wellington OPP were called to the scene of the collision about 11:14 pm which involved an east bound 2007 Saturn and a

westbound 2010 Toyota. Police said the Saturn, driven by the deceased, crossed into the westbound lanes where it was struck head-on by the westbound Toyota, driven by Gordon Blackmore, 60, of Guelph.

Both Debra McKnight and her passenger, Robert Woodcock, 68, of Georgetown were taken to Georgetown Hospital where

McKnight succumbed to her injuries while Woodcock was treated for non-life threatening injuries.

Toyota driver Blackmore was taken to Georgetown Hospital and then airlifted to St. Michael's Hospital in Toronto with non-life threatening injuries.

Members of the Acton Fire Dept. and Halton Regional Police officers also attended to assist Wellington OPP. The OPP's Traffic Management Unit investigated along with the Western Region OPP Technical Collision investigators.

Wellington OPP were called to another head-on collision on the previous night, Sept 18, at about the same time as Saturday's. It involved two Kitchener men driving a 1999 Volk-

swagen Passat and a 2000 Mercury Cougar respectively on Highway 7, west of County Rd. 32, Guelph-Eramosa Twp. One man, John T Walker was taken to Guelph General Hospital with non-life threatening injuries. The other driver was charged with dangerous driving.
