Enlisted November 1914 with 108 th Reg. C.M. under Lt. Col Bowman. Transferred to 118 th Battalion, later to 241st Windsor Scottish Borderers. Baptist.

Born July 25, 1890 and was the only son of Mr. and Mrs. Abraham Albright, 83 King St., West. Kitchener, Ontario. He was married and has one child.

In October 1915 he went to London and qualified as lieutenant and it was with 241 st Windsor Scottish Borderers that he obtained his captaincy. Left Windsor for overseas April 24, 1917 attached to 48 th Highlanders. In March 1918 he was invalided to Italy with trench fever and shell-shock, returning to his battalion in May. He fell at Amiens August 8, 1918 and is buried at Crovy on the River Somme.
