Pte Harvey Guigrich son of Mr. and Mrs. Noah Guigrich, St. Jacobs, enlisted on the 21st of Dec. 1915 at North Bay in the 159th Algonquin Rifles as a Drummer, and trained at North Bay, Carling Camp, London and Camp Borden. He transferred to the 118 Batt. and left for overseas Jan. 9th 1917 on the S.S. Scandinavian. In England he joined the 25th Canadian Reserve and trained at Bramshott, He crossed to France on May 18th 1917 serving in the 1st Entrenching Batt. and in the 1st Canadian Infantry Batt. He saw active service on the Vimy Ridge, Arras, and Lens salients. On Sept 1st 1917 he fell out as a casualty from trench fever at St. Pierre near Lens, and was sent to no. 11 Canadian Hospital at Amiens, and from there to several hospitals in England. On May 6th 1918 he left England on the Hospital ship "Blanchely Castle" and spent some time in London and Guelph Military Hospitals getting his discharge Aug. 20'18
