- 4. Vessels lost by accident We counted HENRY C. DARYAW, EMPEROR, DANIEL J. MORRELL and her sister EDWARD Y. TOWNSEND, the latter lost during a scrap tow on the Alantic. We missed (!!!) GRAINMOTOR and TRANSITER, lost on salt water as ANDY and WITSUPPLY, respectively.
