

The 304-foot MINNESOTA was built in 1888 at Detroit as the New York Central's package freighter (a) HARLEM, becoming a bulk carrier in 1900. She was rebuilt to carry passengers and package freight at Manitowoc and renamed (b) MINNESOTA (II) in 1911. MINNESOTA, which had an iron hull, was cut in two and sent to salt water for wartime service in 1917. She was renamed (c) FELICIANA in 1928 and was scrapped in 1931.

The original of this menu was printed in postcard style. The rendition of the ship was in black and the printing in blue, except for the Crosby Line logo which was done in red.

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
