47 HALTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS EARN ECOSCHOOL STATUS

Forty-seven schools of the Halton District School Board have been certified by the Ontario EcoSchools program for the current school year.

The EcoSchools program recognizes and celebrates schools for their environmental learning and action.

Within the board, 13 schools achieved platinum status, 16 schools were awarded gold level,

10 schools silver level and eight, bronze status.

The schools include 42 elementary and five secondary.

Of note, Abbey Park Secondary School, Hawthorne Village, River Oaks and Ethel Gardiner public schools have been certified for 11 consecutive years.

"We congratulate all members of EcoTeams, staff, students and com-

munity members who have learned about environmental and sustainability issues in and around their schools and taken action to address them," said Suzanne Burwell, the board's environmental sustainability co-ordinator.

"Not only are students learning in the classroom, they are extending that learning beyond the walls of the schools."
