Notice of Study Completion

Thompson Road – Louis Saint Laurent Avenue to Britannia Road

The Town of Milton completed a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) Study for the road improvements on Thompson Road, between Louis Saint Laurent Avenue and Britannia Road. The need for these roadway improvements was identified in the Boyne Survey Secondary Plan. WSP was retained to assist with the study.

The recommendations identified in the Class EA study include the widening of Thompson Road from a two-lane rural road to a four-lane urban road with two lanes in each direction, as well as on-street bike lanes and multi-use paths in the boulevard on both sides of the road.

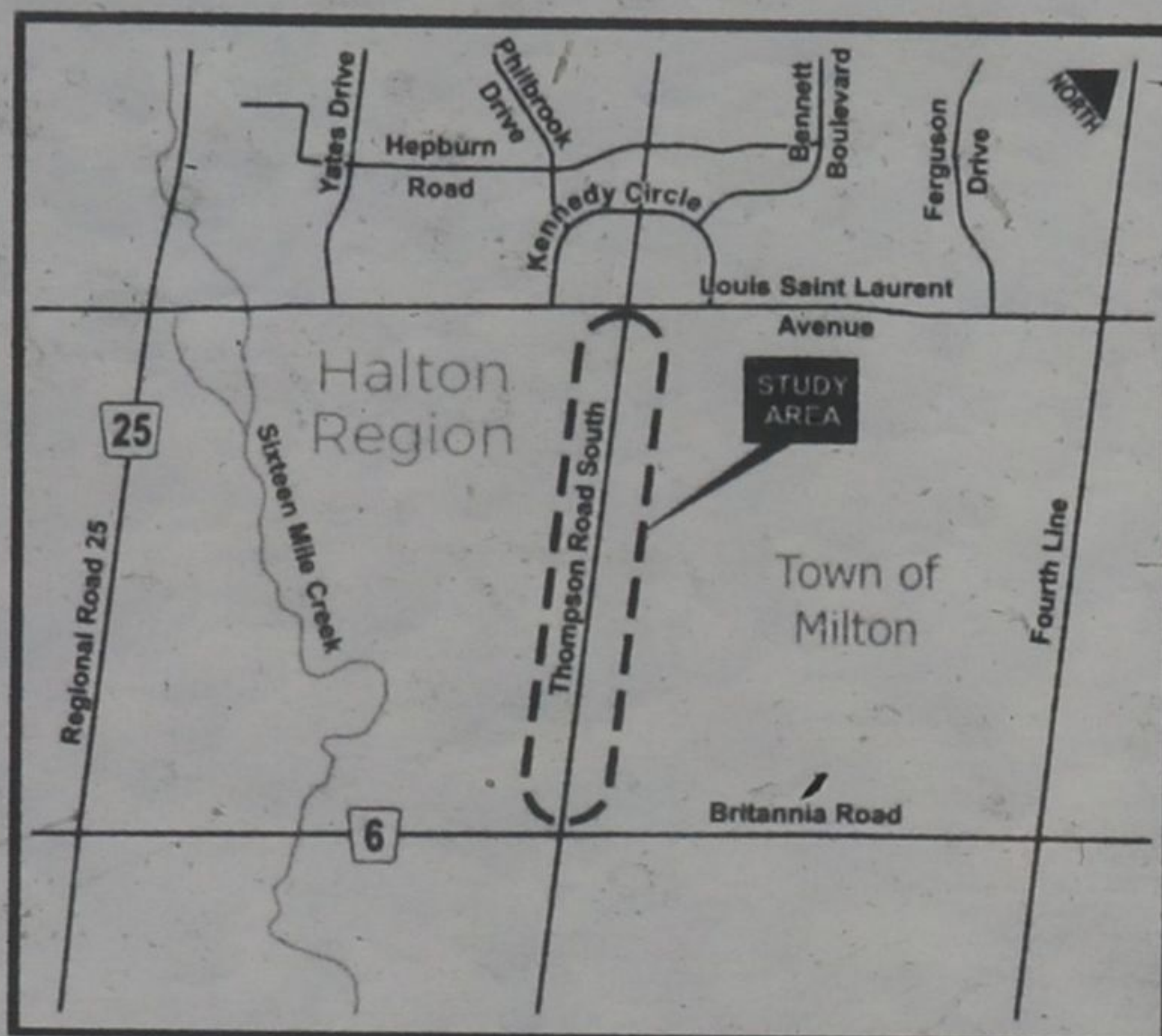
The Town of Milton has prepared an Environmental Study Report (ESR) that documents the study process, consultation efforts and the recommended plan. This Notice of Completion places the ESR on public record for a 45 calendar-day public review period, starting August 15, 2019.

DADS 'STEP UP TO THE PLATE' FOR HALTON WOMEN'S PLACE

The second annual Step-Up to the Plate 2.0 home run derby, hosted by Dads of Milton (DoMs) on Saturday, Aug. 31, will be in support of Halton Women's Place.

The DoMs are a group of more than 800 dads of all ages and backgrounds who support each other and raise money for the community.

"We're about helping the community and we're about setting an example for our children," said Mario Chagas.

Chagas joined DoMs three years ago when the organization approached him after he set up a GoFundMe page for his neighbour, who lost his home in a fire.

Proceeds from last year's debut Step-Up to the Plate fundraiser went to a young father of two who lost his wife suddenly.

"Being a father myself, I

could not imagine going through that ordeal. We knew that we had to do Step-Up as a group to help a fellow dad and community member," said Chagas.

Within five weeks, the first home run derby was organized, a local catering company had donated their services, a local DJ his time and equipment. Additionally, a donated John Tavares jersey - along with items donated by local businesses - had been secured. A Milton restaurant also donated 10 per cent of their revenue to the cause from the end of the event until closing.

"Needless to say the event was a success. We raised \$8,000, which we presented to the widower in the form of two \$4,000 cheques for his children's education."

Throughout the year, the DoMs hold various events such as charity

This year's home run derby will run between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. at Lions Sports Park, 99 Thompson Rd. S. and will feature three categories: Men's, women's and children eight to 17.

Along with the competition, the event will include a dunk tank, magician, DJ and a barbecue presented by the Knights of Columbus.

Local councillors Mike Cluett and Rick Di Lorenzo have "bravely" volunteered to be dunk tank volunteers and Milton MPP Parm Gill will toss out the first pitch.

There will also be several raffle prizes, said Chagas.

Being a member of DoMs, founded by James Secondino, has allowed him not only to get "to know and appreciate his community better," but "to help people when they need help."
