

POLICE LOOKING TO IDENTIFY ALLEGED SCOTCH THIEF

Halton police are looking for one woman following the recent theft of around \$200 worth of Scotch from a Milton LCBO.

At 7 p.m., the individual entered the LCBO at 1025 Bronte St., S., and selected two bottles of Balblair 2005 Highland Single Malt Scotch Whisky.

Police allege she then went to the beer fridge area, waited until she was alone and then concealed the bottles in the shoulder bag she was carrying.

The woman then grabbed a can of beer, which she paid for at the cash register before leaving the store.

The suspect is described as white, in her 20s, approximately five-foot-five and 115 pounds with shoulder length brown hair.

She wore a knee length black puffy coat, blue jeans, black winter boots, a black and pink Louis Vuitton hat and a pink scarf.

She carried a black bag on her right shoulder.
