

Dump delays angering Pomeroy

The final determination of a regional garbage-dump site seems to be eluding Halton as several delays have occurred. The latest indication the region could face another holdup came recently when Chief Administrative Officer Dennis Perlin told regional solid waste management committee the regional consultants believe it would be

better to take 10 to 12 months to do their environmental study of the dump sites to enhance Halton's position before an environmental hearing board. That means the hearing expected for Feb. 1986 could be delayed another four months. But regional chairman Peter Pomeroy said the delays are hurting the region's

credibility, although this latest delay is intended to add yet more substance to the final dump site. "This (delay) is a surprise as far as I'm concerned," Mr. Pomeroy said. "I'm concerned because now we're talking June of next year before we get a hearing." Mr. Pomeroy said the region needs to complete this process as soon as it can. "Everytime we get to another step, the timing is going to take a lot longer. When are we going to be assured we have enough evidence to proceed?"

But Mr. Perlin said the region had been surprised all the way along while following the province's environmental assessment process. "Rushing into a hearing, we don't think is a good idea," he said. "We have to make sure we'll get approvals."

Mr. Perlin added Halton's current situation relates to how tough the province's approval process can be. "We're doing the best we can," he said. In the meantime, the monitoring of spring runoff and water table levels at the four main dump sites (two are in Milton) was approved by the committee. The monitoring is being used to prepare for the environmental approvals and will cost \$9,100 to complete.

Child abuse program passed

The Halton Board of Education has approved the preventive-education-against-child-abuse program and it will be instituted in Halton elementary schools in fall. However, budget constraints prompted the board to reduce the cost from \$33,600 to

\$11,300. The cost cuts mean there will be no project or assistant project manager. The board will get the services of the Sheridan College drama department, however, to put on the play and will purchase a kit for each school.

Accident claims Terry Grant

A 20-year-old Milton man died in an industrial accident Thursday at Sandstone Transport Ltd. on Bronte Rd. Terry Grant, of Bell School Line, was pronounced dead at the scene by Dr. Aikenhead. Mr. Grant died in an explosion and resulting fire. Halton police said although they knew there was a blast and fire, the cause remains a mystery. The accident occurred at 7:30 p.m. There were three other workers in the trucking business at the time. Only Stuart Dainard, 50, of RR 1 Freeleton, was injured suffering smoke inhalation. He was treated at Milton District Hospital and released. The Ontario Fire Marshal's Office and the Ministry of Labour are investigating the blaze and death. A resultant coroner's inquest will depend on their findings. Although officials were reluctant to shed any light on the matter, it is believed Mr. Grant was welding near a container partially filled with an explosive solvent. The business is owned by Mr. Grant's uncle. Mr. Grant worked with Sandstone for about two years.

Reed ends an era

After 10 years in the provincial legislature, Julian Reed will not be back as the MPP for Halton-Burlington. In a surprise announcement Wednesday, Mr. Reed said he would be stepping down for personal reasons. A vocal opponent of Ontario Hydro during his tenure as the energy critic, Mr. Reed will not be on hand to face boohoo friend and next-door neighbour, Peter Pomeroy in the next provincial election. Mr. Pomeroy, the Halton chairman, will run for the Progressive Conservative party. "My decision not to seek reelection is purely personal," he told The Champion. "It is simply a time at the age of 49 to open a new chapter in book. My life experience has always hinged on the element of improbability and seeking new challenges is a part of that life experience." Halton-Burlington Provincial Liberal Association president Al Wilson said the association has accepted the decision by Mr. Reed and now the search is on for a successor. "Although a date for the nomination convention has not been officially set by the executive of the riding association, it could be as early as April 15 or as late as seven days after the writ is issued," he said. Mr. Wilson said the nomination is open to all and interested potential candidates should contact him at 878-7419 (home) or 639-8330 (work).
