January 1922

Good progress is being made in the building of the arena. The brick laying is nearly finished and work on the roof is well advanced. The floor is being leveled for ice-making and removing the cement floor (from the former stable) is giving trouble. Two blasts of dynamite were fired at noon on Tuesday with little effect. A larger one was tried in the evening. The results were better, but a large lump of cement fell in front of a little girl who was walking past on Brown Street, and who had a narrow escape. It is hoped that everything will be ready for the Feb. 1 opening ceremonies.

Christmas was celebrated at the Gordon Home on Monday. Promptly at ten o'clock on Santa Claus appeared to distribute the gifts to the children from a tree laden with all sorts of wonderful things. Dinner was served 3 at noon, after which the children spent the day playing with their new toys.

The first scheduled O.H.A. Intermediate match of the season will be played at the old rink tomorrow, Friday evening, between 2 Bolton and Milton. The contractors are making a big effort to get the new arena ready for an early opening.
