and other experts — scientists who are rethinking the way we understand the animal mind.

"We're such a self-absorbed species," points out Louise Barrett, a University of Lethbridge psychology professor and researcher with the Vervet Monkey Research Project. "We are always asking are they as clever as us? Can they do what we do?" But there is a major difference, she noted, because intelligence is geared to what an animal needs to know to survive in its world — not in ours.

"They're smarter than me," claimed Canadian biologist Andy Hurly.

In an eye-opening experiment, Hurly tests wild hummingbirds' ability to remember when and where they last visited a nectarfilled flower.


