

Milton Yard Waste Collection Begins April 3 Collection Areas A and B



Starting **April 3, 2017**, yard waste is to be collected **once every other week**, on the same day as your garbage.

7am Place your yard waste at the curb by 7 a.m. the morning of your collection day, but no sooner than 5 p.m. the evening before.

- Use paper yard waste bags or reusable, rigid containers (no lid) with a yard waste label.
- Do not use cardboard boxes, plastic bags, compostable or biodegradable bags.
- Tie and bundle brush no larger than 2 m x 1 m (6ft x 3 ft) wide, with branches a maximum of 7.5 cm in diameter.
- To order a yard waste label at no charge, visit halton.ca/wastetools or dial 311.
- Yard waste can also be dropped off at the Halton Waste Management Site (5400 Regional Road 25, Milton, Monday to Saturday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.). Visit halton.ca/hwms for fees.



If you use a private contractor to manage your yard waste or bulk brush, it is your responsibility to inform the contractor of the time and specifications for placing yard waste and bulk brush at the curb for collection.

✓ Acceptable materials

- Leaves & weeds
- Sticks, twigs & tree trimmings
- Decorative cornstalks
- Pumpkins
- Fallen fruit from trees
- Yard and garden trimmings
- Tie and bundle brush no larger than 2 m x 1 m (6ft x 3 ft) wide, with branches a maximum of 7.5 cm in diameter.

✗ Unacceptable materials

- Tree stumps and trunks (over 7.5 cm in diameter)
- Sod, soil, clay and rocks
- Plastic shopping or garbage bags
- Plastic flower/plant pots (acceptable in Blue Box)
- Flower/plant markers and tags

Yard waste is turned into high-quality compost which is made available for residents to pick-up, free of charge, at the **Compost Giveaway events** at the Halton Waste Management Site:

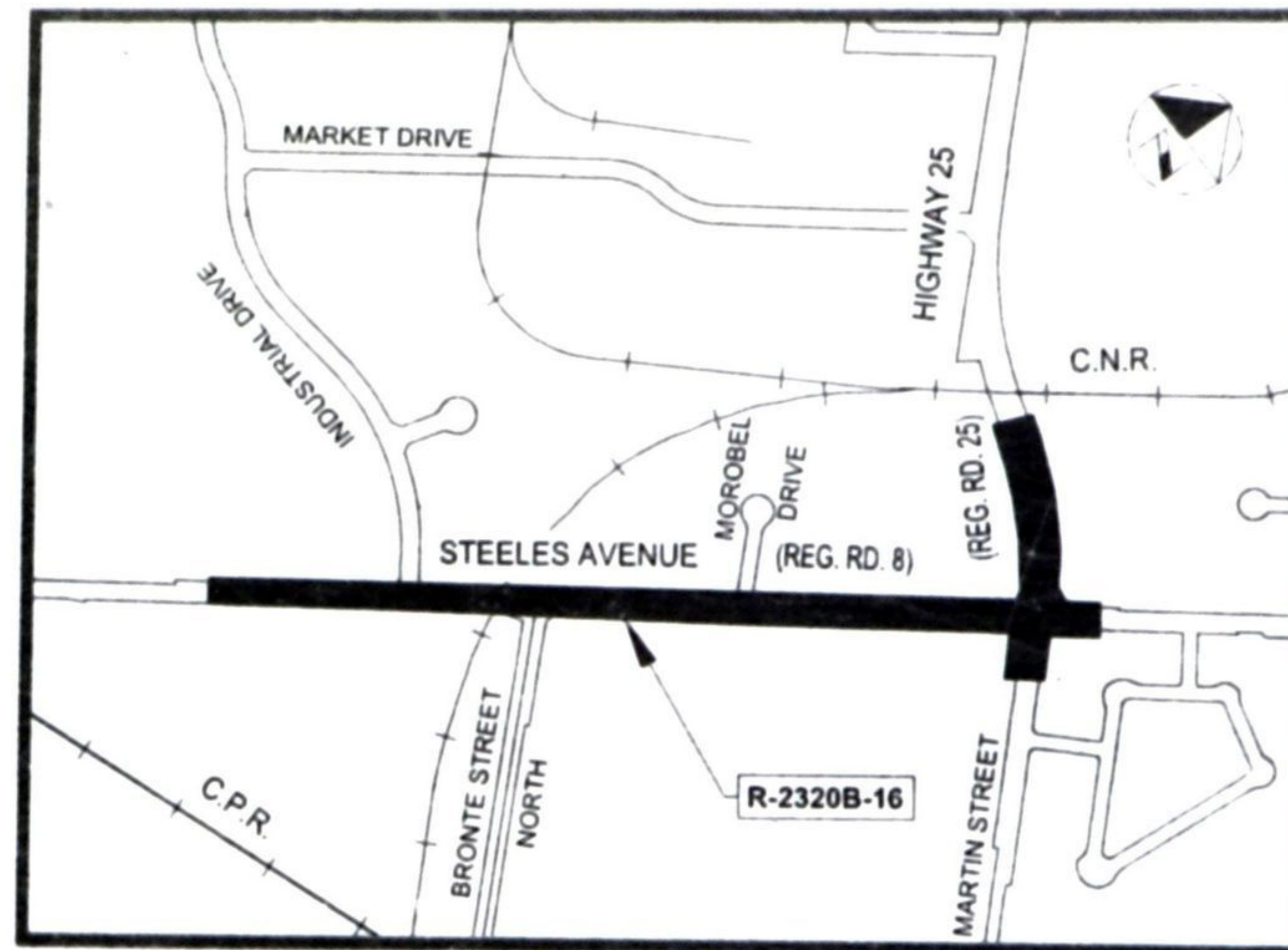
