TINY QUEEN TO REIGN OVER 16TH ANNUAL KIWANIS KIDS' DAY PEANUT SALE

A diminutive seven year old charmer with a sunny smile and a personality to match won the hearts of keen-eyed judges in the Sheraton-Chicago Hotel Saturday, August 20 to win the crown of "Kiwanis Little Miss Peanut" for 1966.

Claudia Gray, 301 Circle, Island Lake. Ill., was selected from seven finalists who had won local and divisional Little Miss Peanut contests sponsored by Chicagoland Kiwanis Clubs. She was sponsored by the McHenry, Illinois Club.

Claudia will reign as Queen over a series of events during the coming month. culminating in the 16th Annual Kiwanis Kids' Day Peanut Sale, September 23. She will receive more than a thousand

dollars in prizes.

The six other finalists in the Little Miss Peanut Contest will serve as the queen's royal court, assisting her in a round of public appearances over the next four weeks.
