MRS. HUGH O'DONALD.
Passes Away at Her Home at Ridgefield, Illinois.

Lillian Whiston, beloved wife of Hugh O'Donald, was born in Ridgefield, Ill., May 7, 1882, and died at her home in Nunda township, April 5th, 1906, after an illness of 10 days, aged 23 years, 10 months and 29 days.

Deceased had always enjoyed good health and there gave every indication of a long, happy and useful life. The hopes for a long one were to be blighted like the flower of spring, which, given promise of summer bloom and fragrance only to be cut down by the chilling wind and storm, so this fair life bloomed for a little time, only to be cut down by the chilling hand of death. Always a lover of home, she had preferred to remain in her parents' home, and had never left it. Devoted to her family always, eager to help others, willing to bear the heaviest end of life's burdens, these will be some of the things which will make her memory precious and keep it fresh in the hearts of those so deeply wounded by her early death.

The sympathy of this community goes out to the members of this bereaved family, whose grief it is impossible for them to share in full, but who realize how dependent we are one upon another, and how in common we share our grief and joys, rejoice with those that rejoice and weep with those that weep.
