DIES SUDDENLY.
Dr. William Fegers Expires Suddenly at Pistakee Bay.

The citizens of McHenry and vicinity were very much shocked yesterday morning upon learning the sad news of the death of Dr. William Fegers, which occurred at the Fegers' camp at Palm Beach, Pistakee Bay, that morning.
The doctor, in company with the McGee girls, had been in camp at the beautiful resort for some time. On Tuesday evening, on account of the extreme dampness, the girls decided to go to McHenry for the night, leaving the doctor in charge of the camp alone. The doctor seemed in the best of health on the departure of the girls the evening before and from all circumstances he got up at the usual time the next morning, as his body was found lying beside the ice box, where he had undoubtedly gone while preparing his breakfast. His body was found by the milkman, who was making his usual morning delivery. Dr. C. H. Fegers, his brother, was at once notified and in the afternoon, after the inquest had been held, the body was brought to McHenry. The funeral will take place from St. Mary's church tomorrow (Friday) morning. Obituary next week.

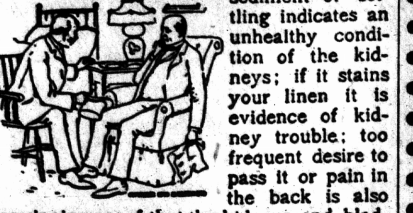
