Arkansas Razorbacks.
A man who claimed to know what he was talking about is thus quoted by the Mineral Wells Index: "Arkansas has a greater variety of hogs and less pork and lard than any state in the Union. An average hog weighs fourteen pounds when dressed, with its head on, and six and a half pounds with its head off. It can outrun a greyhound, jump a rail fence, climb like a parrot, and live on grass, roots and rabbit tracks. It hasn't much tail or bristle but has plenty of gall. It will lick a wolf or a bear in a fair fight. It is called a razorback because it is shaped like a sunfish. In the razorbacks they are always on the roadside on for there is not a sign of a show of hitting them otherwise, any more than to shoot at a split shingle. This type can drink milk out of a quart jar on account of its long, thin head. It is generally known as the stone hog because its head is so heavy and its nose so long that it balances up behind. The owner of this type of hog usually ties a stone to its tail to keep it from overbalancing. If the stone is too heavy it will pull the skin over its eyes and it will go blind."

WON QUITE A LEGAL VICTORY.

Mrs. Robert Esh of Spring Grove successful in lawsuit.

Mrs. Robert Esh of Spring Grove was successful in her suit against Mrs. Alice Moore of Galva, Ill., and as a result will get \$600, so says the Richmond Gazette.

The case wears a peculiar phase and Mrs. Esh came near being cheated out of a nice prize through the cunningness of the defendant. It appears that more than a year ago John Baker, an eccentric character, who owned a small place at Grass Lake, died at the home of Mrs. Esh. He was taken ill at his home, and not having any one to care for him, was taken to the Esh home, where he received the best of care.

He handed Mrs. Esh, in the presence of witnesses, a tin box, saying that the box and contents were to be hers. Before Mr. Baker died his niece, Mrs. Alice Moore, came to see him, and remained until after his death and burial. She secured the tin box from Mrs. Esh by telling her that a will had been found in the house of the decedent, by the terms of which the property of the deceased, consisting of real estate at Grass Lake, worth about \$1000, and the box, containing about \$1200, were to go to his niece, Mrs. Moore.

Mrs. Esh determined to investigate the matter and engaged Attorney J. I. Lang of this village. He learned from Mrs. Esh that in the box was a certificate of deposit in the sum of \$600 on a bank in Galva, Ill. Mr. Lang had payment on the certificate stopped, and when Mrs. Moore appeared at Waukegan to probate the supposed will Mr. Lang started suit, and was successful in all the hearings of the court.

The amount of money in the box was never counted by Mrs. Esh but is estimated at \$1200. Attorney Lang refused to talk of the case except to say that the settlement was satisfactory in view of all the circumstances.
