SCHOOL EXHIBIT AT FAIR

THIS FEATURE TO BE LARGER AND BET-
TER THAN EVER

On Wednesday of the fair there will be held Rural School day, at which more than one hundred certificates of promotion to high school will be awarded to eighth grade graduates of the rural county schools. In addition to the awarding of these certificates, the county spelling contest will be held to determine who are the three champion spellers of McHenry county. Appropriate prizes will be given to the three highest. At the township exercises held this last spring, the three best spellers in each township were selected in a public spelling contest.

The program for the Rural school day will be held in the circuit court room in the court house at Woodstock at 10:00 a. m., and will close at noon, that all the pupils and students who take part may attend the fair in the afternoon. Complimentary tickets will be given at the above exercises to those who have earned a certificate or who have taken part in the county spelling contest. A large audience of parents and friends of the pupils attend these exercises each year. There is no better way of honoring the work of these children or of placing emphasis upon the value of education than to attend with the children the exercises that crown their efforts of eight years of school work. CHANGES IN PARCEL POST

WEIGHT LIMIT IS INCREASED FROM 11 TO
20 POUNDS

On and after tomorrow, Aug. 15, 1913, the limit of weight of parcels of fourth class mail for delivery within the first and second zones shall be increased from eleven pounds to twenty pounds. The rate of postage on parcels exceeding four ounces in weight shall be five cents for the first pound and one cent for each additional two pounds or fraction thereof when intended for local delivery, and five cents for the first pound and one cent for each additional pound or fraction thereof when intended for delivery at other offices within the first and second zones.

The pound rates of postage in the first and second zones shall be as follows:

The rate for local delivery shall apply to all parcels mailed at a post-office from which a rural route starts, for delivery on such route, or mailed at any point on such route for delivery at any other point thereon, or at the office from which the route starts, or on any rural route starting therefrom, and on all matter mailed at a city carrier office, or any point within its delivery limits, for delivery by carrier from that office, or at any office for local delivery.

Fresh meats and other articles mentioned in paragraph 2, section 34, Parcel Post Regulations, when inclosed and wrapped in the manner prescribed by the last sentence of that paragraph will be accepted for mailing to offices within the first and second zones.
