MR. ARTHUR GERRY

This June, Mr. Arthur Gerry will retire as Technical Director at Niagara District Secondary School. At this time it seems appropriate to recall some of Mr. Gerry's contributions to this school, his profession and community.

Mr. Gerry began teaching drafting at Niagara Falls Collegiate in 1957 after graduating from Ontario College of Education. He was appointed Technical Director at Niagara District in 1961 and supervised the construction and equipping of the technical wing of this school. It should be noted that these facilities are still considered as one of the best in the county. Over the many years, Mr. Gerry has contributed his time and energy to many professional, educational and community projects and programs. He is a member of the Ontario Education Association, and a former president of the Ontario Technical Directors' Association. In our school he has participated in the United Nations Club, Unicef programs, Twenty-Fifth Anniversary Committee, Advisory, Vocational and the Scholarship Committees.

He has carried his involvement outside the school and has participated in the Niagara Historical Society functions and fund raising drives and at present is a member of the St. David's Lions Club. Mr. Gerry has not limited his efforts to this community or country but has shared his expertise in Africa between 1965-67 where he taught at the Technical College in Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania. It is obvious from these brief notes Mr. Gerry has had a full and successful career.

When Mr. Gerry retires he plans to spend his time renovating his home and continuing his participation in community life and service. All who know him will miss his contributions but join together in wishing Arthur a long and happy retirement.
