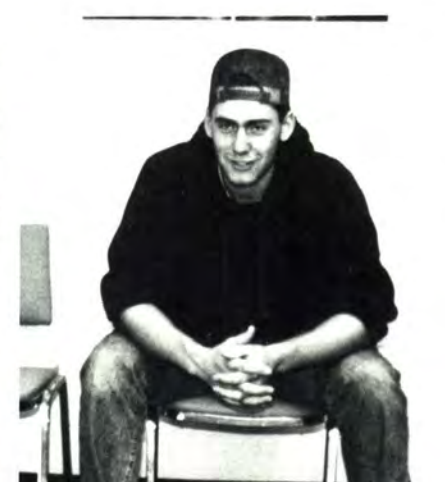

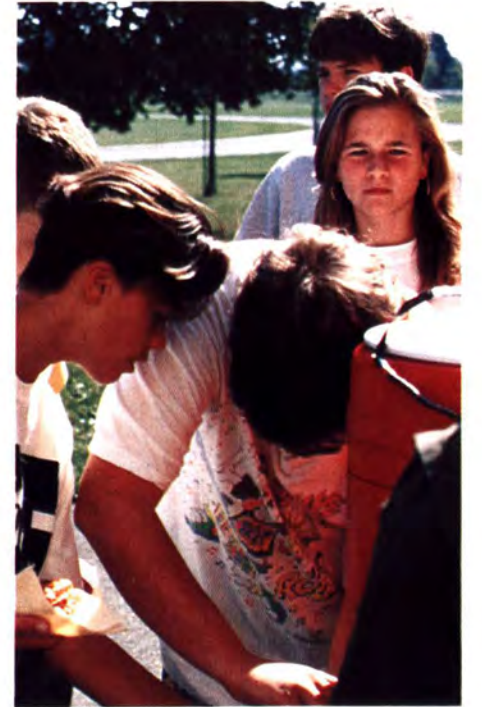

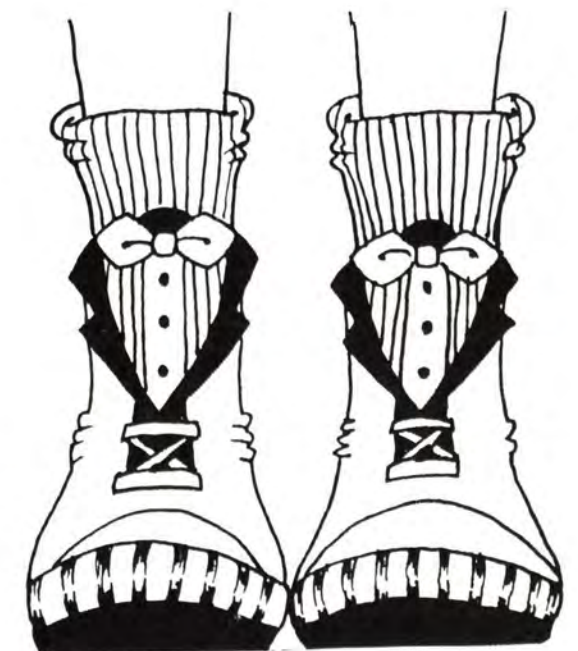

VALEDICTORY ADDRESS Nov. 3/89



This is dedicated to Barry Ward. Good evening ladies and gentlemen. I hope you're all doing well, to those of you who travelled I hope you had an unfettered journey.

I'm kind of a procrastinator and, to tell you the truth, I only started writing this address hm... what time is it anyway... well a couple of weeks ago. I went through quite a few versions until I arrived at the correct one. A lot of them started out in a pretty dogmatic way. For example, quotes such as these come to mind. The students are the "Vanguard of the new age, fists raised in the splendour of the guiding light." Gosh, sounds a bit like Mein Kampf. But it really is easy to slip into "Valedictorian address mode" and just sort of spout such eloquence.

And I don't mind telling you, I'm anything but a vanguard and I think the last time I had my fist raised was when I was trying to punch out that cockroach in my apartment. Sucker must've been about 6 feet tall. Could've taken out Mike Tyson.

I mean, I don't think anyone who's attending a university or college or is out in the work force or any other

state institute really see themselves as anything but completely insignificant. 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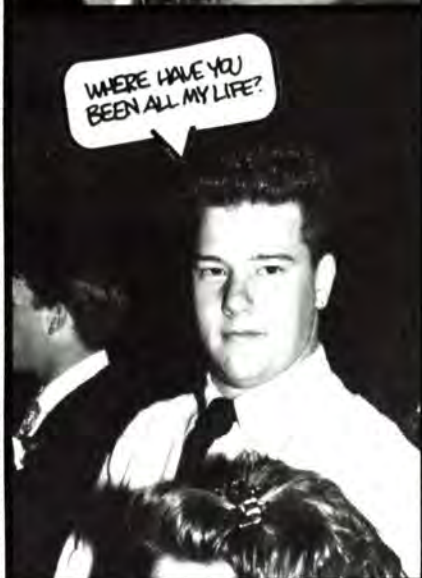
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DEDICATION . . .
