THE BURSARY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM OF THE ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION, ONTARIO PROVINCIAL COMMAND CHARITABLE FOUNDATION, AND THE LADIES' AUXILIARY OF THE ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION, ONTARIO PROVINCIAL COMMAND, HAS BUDGETED MONIES FOR BURSARY PROGRAMS.

The program is designed to assist students entering or continuing post secondary education including courses and programs of technical and vocational nature outside of and beyond secondary school. Approved bursary assistance is not based upon scholastic standing, but rather the combination of acceptable admission status to a post secondary institution or successful completion of one or more years leading to a recognized degree, diploma or certificate and demonstrated or documented need.

The maximum amount of assistance granted to a student shall be up to but not to exceed \$700.00 for each scholastic year, September — August. Students entering a diploma or certificate course, usually of a shorter duration with reduced tuition, may be granted assistance at a rate to be determined by the District Bursary Committee. Indentured apprentices may apply for assistance for the purchase of tools and instruments.

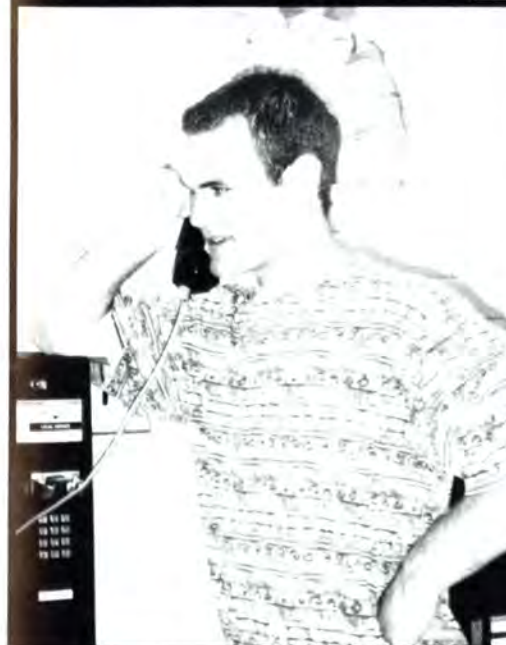

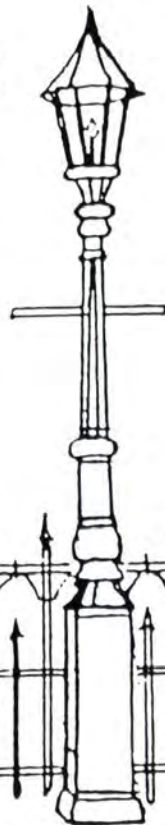

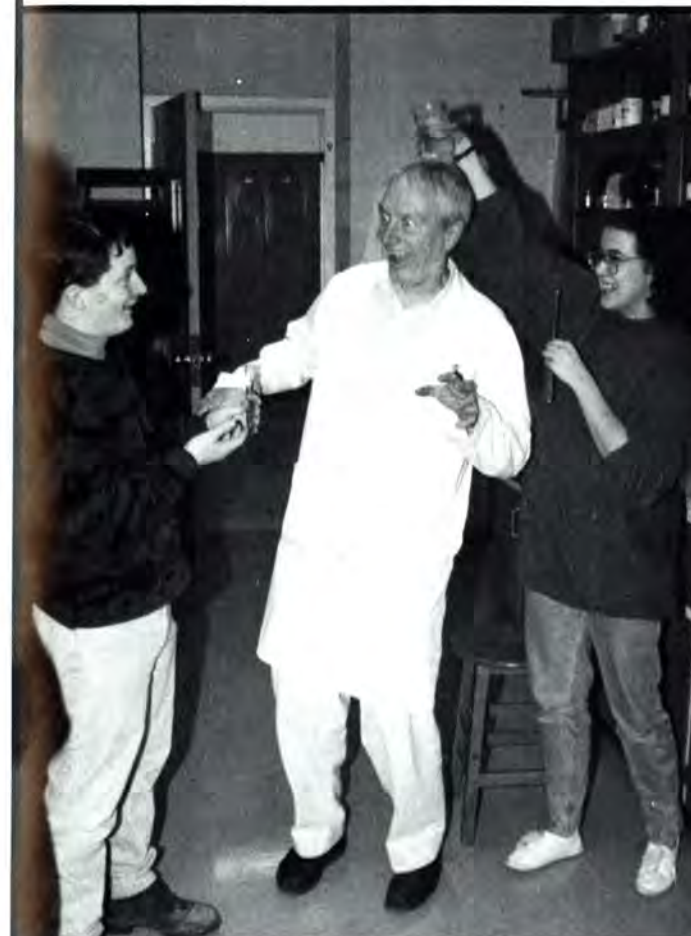
