Canes' Factory.

The logs are coming in again from Penetang at the rate of about 12 cars a day.

On Monday, while engaged with a gang of men hauling logs from the depot to the yard, Mr. Geo. Greensides was badly hurt internally by a log rolling upon him. One rib was broken.

The new boiler is in position but will not be connected for service till next Wednesday, when the factory will be shut down for that purpose.

The new brick addition to the factory is now roofed in and the floors laid for two stories. The new engine is being put in position and the hangers are ready for one line of shafting.

As soon as the addition is in running order, and also the stove building at the rear, it is the intention of the firm to tear down the present lumber dry kilns and build in their place a group of six kilns on a stone foundation, 75 feet square, all under one roof.

Every department of the factory is crowded with orders. The firm has run out of screen wire and it seems impossible to get hold of any, which is causing a vexatious delay of several cars of screen doors and windows.

Three Days' Show.

The Directors of the North York Ag. Society have shown a great deal of enterprise the past two or three years, but this year is going to break the record.

The Prize List is being revised and modified so as to bring out a larger exhibit. In addition to this the Board are negotiating for the Wild West Show to give a free exhibition of fast riding, horsemanship, chariot races, etc., all three days.

In order to provide against the meanness of many people who hang around the grounds to see the show for nothing over the fence, the Directors have decided to tear down the present fence and put up a new one nine feet high.

A monster concert will be held in the Skating Rink on the second night.
