darkness of the place and as we wandered through, its beauty began to impress us.

But besides the attractions of its beauty of architecture, there are buried in great stone coffins most of England's past Sovereigns, and beneath the cold flags of the floors and cloister-walks, repose the bodies of scores of England's noted dead, and around its walls are busts and tablets to the memory of England's past warriors, patriots, statesmen, poets, scientists, inventors and theologians. I cannot begin to enumerate the list of monuments but there are some which we could not overlook. There was Sir Robert Peel and Benjamin Disraeli, prime ministers, Wm. Pitt, Warren Hastings, and amongst the explorers David Livingstone, John Wesley, also Charles Wesley, Major John Andre, Darwin, and Wilberforce.

In the poets' corner are such names—as Chaucer, Dryden, Milton, Gray, Ben. Johnson, Campbell, Shakespeare, Burns, Goldsmith, Southey, etc., and John Gay, with the epitaph written by himself:—

"Life is a jest, and all things show it;
I thought so once, but now I know it."

and in the button-hole of the bust of the American poet, Longfellow, some admiring Americans had placed a fresh nose-gay.

We wandered through the chapels, and into the beautiful Henry VII chapel with its elegant fan-shaped roof, and along to Edward the Confessor's chapel, where are the Coronation chairs of carved Oak. Beneath the older one is the famous stone of Scone, on which the Kings of Scotland and Ireland sat when they were crowned, and is said to be the very stone on which Jacob pillowed his head, when he saw the vision of the angels and the ladder. Edward first brought it to England in 1296, and since then it has been beneath the chair on which every sovereign of England has been seated when receiving the crown.

These old musty chapels are in a good state of repair. Some of the monuments look like immense fine places in design, and inside one chapel is a recumbent figure of Thomas Cecil, Earl of Exeter, his first wife is lying beside him on the right, but the place for his second wife, which was on his left, is vacant, she having refused to be buried beside him if she could not be on the right side.

But we tired of seeing so much although it was so interesting and instructive and wandered out into the cloisters and procured a guide. He shewed us round and we saw through the school building and in the centre of Westminster school, founded by Queen Elizabeth,

cooked meats, fruit and vegetables of his own growing, wines, spirits, oils, flowers, tobacco, confectionery, dry goods of every description, hardware, crockery, and I cannot begin to enumerate the articles for sale. They have a "zoo" where you can buy parrots, turtles, dogs, and I said to one of the attendants, where are your elephants? said he, we don't keep them in stock sir but if you will leave your order we can have one for you in a few days, or any kind of a wild beast you may desire. You can hire a servant, engage a doctor, buy a tourist ticket, and it is said if absolutely necessary you can get a wife, but I guess he draws the line at making matches. There is nine stated deliveries daily, within a radius of three miles, about 5000 people are employed about the premises and taken all together it is perhaps the most wonderful store on earth. His catalogue informs you that he will furnish funerals and states the price anywhere from £5 to £100. He sells tombstones, furniture, photo supplies, band and musical instruments, drugs and druggists supplies, books, will furnish a house complete, and an entertainment of any kind either musical or dramatical and in fact you only have to ask and it will be given you, and the proprietor requests that any incivility or inattention on the part of the employes be reported to him and marked "private."

But we leave the stores and London too, not without regret. I shall need to go back to London and stay a month to see it properly it has so many attractions and is such a large city. One of the impressions of London is its vastness, and it is said that they are adding to it at the rate of about fifty miles of new streets yearly.

Surely Mr. Editor none but the sturdy Saxon could live together in such large numbers and be peaceful, and one of the wonders is that the largest city in the world is so well governed, that barring the thieves, one is as safe in London as in our own quiet village of Port Perry.

Timber Management Guidelines for the Protection of Cultural Heritage Resources

September 1991



These Guidelines reflect the professional and technical advice presented and/or developed in a number of workshops (see page iv for workshop participants). As such, they reflect the “conventional wisdom” regarding the protection of cultural heritage resources within the context of the timber management planning process and the implementation of the developed plan. These Guidelines will be updated on a need basis.

The reader is reminded that there are also several Acts and Regulations that protect the heritage resources of the Province. In addition to the Crown Timber Act and the Environmental Assessment Act, under which the Timber Management Planning process functions, there are also a number of primary Acts and Regulations that are relevant to heritage conservation. They include the Ontario Heritage Act, the Cemeteries Act and the Planning Act. At the time of writing, these Guidelines were consistent with and reflect the intent and policies established under these Acts and Regulations.

There may also be in effect Native treaties or Federal and/or Provincial Agreements concerning Native rights which protect and conserve heritage resources. Where these exist, they are to be respected.

The Guidelines are based on the Timber Management Planning process as described by the
