From the National Post's most talked about columnist to best-selling author
Linda McQuaig continues a great tradition of nationally prominent speakers at OLA



According to our opening plenary speaker, we are living in a "culture of machismo: endless government bravado on deficit cutting and inflation control, while government officials lose their testosterone when it comes to fighting unemployment or delivering social programs. Governments are practising selective impotence."

Journalist/author Linda McQuaig gives us a fabulous kick-off to Super Conference '99. She discusses libraries, librarians, and the choices we have in controlling our future. Control, and who has it is the major theme running through her work.

A nationally watched columnist

McQuaig has written for The Globe and Mail, The Toronto Star and Maclean's Magazine and currently is a columnist with the National Post. She is a political and economic commentator for CBC Radio.

McQuaig received an Atkinson Fellowship for journalism in 1991, for public policy to study the social welfare systems in Europe and North America. Her 1993 book, *The wealthy banker's wife: the assault on equality in Canada* was the result.

Her other books include: *Behind closed doors: how the rich won control of Canada's tax system*, *The quick and the dead: Brian Mulroney, big business and the seduction of Canada*, and *Shooting the hippo: death by deficit and other Canadian myths*.


Town Hall Meeting this afternoon at 2 p.m.

Some highlights from the Vision List include: an Ontario Library Card enabling free borrowing from any publicly funded library in the province, the accreditation of Librarians and Information Specialists, representation for libraries at the tables of power, universal access across present ministerial boundaries, the recognition of libraries as the defenders of freedom of information including intellectual freedom, and libraries being the major players for public access to information.
