

OLITA announces Canadian scientist to give Super Session

Paul Hoffert gets national attention and Super Conference berth

PAUL HOFFERT is the latest major name to be added to the roster of Super Conference '99. The popular scientist. researcher and professor from York University is making a splash with his new book, The Bagel Effect. He takes over OLITA's Saturday Super Session (#1102) from Bill Joy who was forced to withdraw.

Hoffert is Director of CulTech Collaborative Research Centre at York University. He is the mastermind behind the world's first totally wired, interactive community, a \$100 million project which The Financial Post described as "quite possibly the world's most



important interactive multimedia trial." He is past Chair of the Ontario Arts Council.
