Volunteers@Your Library: Benefits and Pitfalls of Volunteers in Hospital Libraries

Hospital, public, school and other special libraries have all experienced reduced funding in recent years. Given the new reality of fiscal restraints, a librarian may willingly, or through administrative pressures, turn to volunteers in lieu of paid staff as a way of providing services. It has been suggested that treating volunteers as unpaid staff could lead to the belief that volunteers could replace paid staff when public spending is reduced. There is a real risk that jobs can be lost. The need to examine the volunteer issue is timely due to the long-term financial constraints on both Canadian and Ontario hospital funding. As part of a survey conducted in April 2003, Ontario hospital library managers were asked to identify what they perceived to be the two main benefits and two main pitfalls of using volunteers. This presentation outlines the extent of volunteer use in Ontario hospital libraries and describes the benefits and potential pitfalls of using volunteers in libraries. Key factors that should be resolved prior to establishing a volunteer program and strategies for optimizing the use of volunteers in your library will be presented. Funding for this research was provided through a Chapter Initiative Grant from the Canadian Health Libraries Association/Association des bibliothèques de la santé du Canada.

OLITA Spotlight: Children's Discovery Portal

The Canadian National Institute for the Blind (CNIB) launched their Digital Library on November 12, 2003. The online library is the most advanced library of alternative formats in the world and a model for 175 international libraries producing alternativeformat information. It also contains The Children's Discovery Portal, the world's first portal of its kind for children who are blind. Children who are blind or visually impaired can play online games, participate in online polls, get homework help, sample or read entire books online and chat with other children who are blind from across the country. For some this may be the first opportunity they have ever had to meet another child who is blind. "The whole Portal is cool but I especially love the chat room because I can speak to other kids like me," said 11-yearold CNIB client Robert Hampson. "I also like playing games like Dreadnought and it's fun to be able to read books right away instead of waiting for them to arrive in the mail." Carrie and Elizabeth will discuss the elements that went into the

development of the children's portal, as well as giving a demonstration of this unique kids space.
