Oakville defender caps career by being named to all-tourney team

Traci Galbraith scored twice in the semifinal and was named to the all-tournament team but the big prize that she and her RIT Tiger teammates were chasing, got away.

Norwich defeated RIT 5-2 in Saturday's NCAA Division III women's hockey final, denying the Tigers their first national

Galbraith finished her senior season as RIT's leading scorer from the blueline with eight goals and 25 points. She finished her four-year career with 23 goals and 74 points in 109 games.
