## Town gets \$15 million

The Town of Oakville announced Friday it has received \$15 million from a trio of developers in fulfillment of the 2006 North Oakville Secondary Plan (NOSP) settlement agreement.

Under the agreement, the developers — Great Gulf Group, Mattamy Homes and Trinison Management — get to develop in north Oakville. under the North Oakville Secondary Plan.

In exchange, one of the things the Town gets is money allocated towards the development and construction of North Park, including the newly opened Sixteen Mile Sports Complex, located on Neyagawa Boulevard just north of Dundas Street.

As per the agreement, the developers agreed in 2006 to fund the early construction of community facilities at North Park by way of a \$10 million prepayment of development charges and an additional \$5 million voluntary contribution to the Town.

"North Park will be the cornerstone of Oakville's newest neighbourhoods north of Dundas Street," said Oakville Mayor Rob Burton.

"The fulfillment of this agreement shows a dedication to putting the community first."
