suspect(s) smashed the glass out of the pharmacy door and then ran into the pharmacy where they grabbed OxyContin, Dilaudid and other narcotics before fleeing the

The suspect(s) triggered an alarm when they broke into the store, but left the area before the arrival of police.

A similar break-in took place Saturday, July

16, at Abbey Pharmacy, located at Nottinghill Gate.

Again, suspect(s) smashed through the door to enter the pharmacy where they stole OxyContin and other narcotics.

This break-in also took place at around 2:30 a.m., and while an alarm triggered the suspect(s) were able to leave the area before the arrival of police.

Police said they believe the two break-ins are connected.

Dry weather fodder for fire

The Oakville Fire Department is reminding residents to be careful with fire in this dry weather after a small fire was sparked in Oakville's Jonathan Park.

Oakville firefighters were called to the park at around 7 p.m. Wednesday after residents spotted smoke coming from a wooded area.

Firefighters attended and discovered two smoldering logs, which they then extinguished.

While the situation was easily dealt with, Oakville Fire Department Prevention Officer Michael Harrison

warned the situation could have been much worse — especially with hot weather turning vegetation

"Big fires start from small fires," said Harrison.

"Children or anybody playing with matches or lighters in wooded areas, such as this park, can start a fire that can get out of hand very quickly, so we are asking people not to do this especially during this dry

Harrison said someone flicking a cigarette into the brush could have been enough to start this fire.

Halton Region is committed to providing residents and businesses with safe, clean drinking water, and routinely tests for the presence of lead in the



(Homes built before 1952 may have lead service connections or internal lead plumbing, and homes built before 1990 may have lead solder connecting copper pipes.)
- Halton staff will require access to your property to collect a sample.
- Testing is free and the results will be shared with you.
