## Fresh air announcement from province

The Ontario Minister of the Environment implemented a key recommendation from the South West GTA Air Quality Task Force, Wednesday, which is intended to help Oakville residents breath easier.

"Today, we are taking the next step as we continue to clean up the air we breathe. I am confident that a community-based approach to air management will improve air quality.

Flanked Oakville's municipal and provincial representatives against the serene backdrop of Gairloch Gardens, Minister John Wilkinson announced the implementation of a new pilot project within the Oakville-Clarkson Airshed that will see regional organizations, local businesses, industry and the community work together on a plan to improve air quality.

The next steps in the project will include finalizing the Terms of Reference, which will reflect the needs of all the project's partners; increased mobile air monitoring by the Province, the continuation of the monitoring of emissions sources, and the use of this data to assess progress.

"Today, we are taking the next step as we continue to clean up the air we breathe. I am confident that a community-based approach to air management will help improve air quality," said Wilkinson.
