Man faces charges in \$11M fraud

A 39-year-old former Oakville resident is facing a series of criminal charges in connection with an alleged \$11-million investment fraud based out of Oakville.

The Halton Regional Police Service Regional Fraud Unit announced Thursday, it has concluded a 12-month investigation into the companies RBL Capital Corporation and Brekland Realty Group, which it alleges were used to defraud more than 70 investers over an approximate five year period of operation.

Director of the two companies Jason Robert Laramee, 39, of Mississauga, has been charged with three counts of fraud over \$5,000, three counts of possession of the proceeds of crime,

Oakville couple searching for mysterious **Good Samaritan**

An Oakville man is hoping the Good Samaritan responsible for saving his life earlier this month will come forward and receive some much deserved recognition.

On Tuesday, April 2, at around 6:05 p.m. Brian

Hoffman, 54, was cycling home from work when he suffered a massive heart attack and collapsed in the area of Upper Middle Road and Joshua Creek

Hoffman's wife, Denise Frenette, said several people rushed to where he had fallen, including one stranger who began performing CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation).

"Apparently there's good CPR and bad CPR and this person performed really good CPR," said Frenette.


"They knew what they were doing and that's why my husband is alive today."
