

Oakville-Trafalgar nurse facing 52 charges

A 31-year-old part-time registered practical nurse at Oakville-Trafalgar Memorial Hospital is facing 52 charges in connection with a series of thefts and frauds against several elderly patients.

Halton police said the arrest followed a collaborative investigation with Halton Healthcare Services (HHS), which was initiated after seven elderly women, who were in-patients at the hospital, were victims of various thefts and/or fraud-related incidents.

A Mississauga man was arrested Thursday and faces charges including: possession of a stolen credit card, using a stolen credit card, identity theft, attempted fraud under \$5,000 and fraud under \$5,000.

Police suspect there could be additional victims and are appealing to anyone with information to contact the Oakville Criminal Investigations Bureau at 905-825-4747, ext. 2214 or 2215.

In a media release issued by the hospital, officials stated the police investigation was launched at the request of HHS.

They also said the accused has been suspended pending the outcome of the investigation.

"HHS would like to reassure patients and their families that the hospital has been and will continue to work cooperatively with the police on this investigation," stated the release.
