Oliver highest paid in Halton: Sunshine List

Halton Healthcare Service's (HHS) President and CEO John Oliver was the highest-paid public sector official in Halton in 2013.

According to the Province of Ontario's 'Sunshine List,' which discloses public sector salaries for individuals making more than \$100,000 a year, Oliver received \$477,689.76 in salary and taxable benefits.

This is slightly higher than the \$477,520.48 he was paid in 2012, but slightly less than the \$477,838.62 he received in 2011.

The Sunshine List shows HHS also employs the second-highest paid public sector employee in Halton with HHS Chief of Staff Dr. Lorne Martin receiving \$427,992.59 in salary and taxable benefits in 2013.

HHS had 111 employees on the 2013 list, up from 89 in 2012 and 80 in 2011.

Flynn says his computer not among those seized by OPP

As Ontario's Premier and Opposition leader fling allegations and threats, Oakville MPP Kevin Flynn — the province's new Minister of Labour — said his Queen's Park computer was not among the 24 seized as part of an Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) investigation.

The OPP is investigating the allegation that key information — pertaining to the \$1.1-billion power plant scandal — was erased from computers at Queen's Park.

None of the allegations have been proven in court.
