# **HHS names Hardenne interim president and CEO**

The announcement was made last week by the HHS board of directors.

In 2007, she was promoted to senior vicepresident and holds the title of HHS executive vice-president. She has been responsible for leadership in hospital operations, quality and

She is also the executive lead for operational readiness planning across all three of HHS hospital redevelopment projects — HHS oversees Oakville Trafalgar Memorial Hospital, Milton District Hospital and Georgetown Hospital.

"Denise will work closely with John (Oliver) during the month of April to transition into this interim role," said Judy Wilson, HHS

"This appointment will provide continuity and stability within the organization while the

board concludes its search process."

Hardenne graduated from the University of Saskatchewan with Bachelor of Science and Master of Community Economic Development (MCED) degrees.

She has a Wharton School of Business fellowship in management for chief nurse executives and has completed the Rotman not-for-profit governance essentials program. Hardenne also has an MBA (Masters Business Administration) from Queen's Uni-
