Three Oakville residents in NLL final

The National Lacrosse League final doesn't begin until this weekend, but it's already guaranteed at least one Oakville resident will earn the right to hoist the Champion's Cup above his head this spring.

The Calgary Roughnecks will take on the Rochester Knighthawks in the 2014 NLL championship series, which begins Saturday in Calgary and concludes with Game 2 May 31 in Rochester. If each team wins a game, a 10-minute tiebreaker will be played immediately following the conclusion of Game 2 to determine the league champion.

Brothers Dan and Paul Dawson are members of the Knighthawks, while Oakville Buzz product Dan MacRae plays for the Roughnecks.

Rochester, seeking an unprecedented third straight NLL crown, advanced to the final by defeating the Buffalo Bandits in the East Division final. Calgary upset the top-seeded Edmonton Rush — which features Oakville native Chris Corbeil — in the West championship series. Both division $\stackrel{\mbox{\scriptsize N}}{\sim}$ finals required sudden-death overtime to decide after the teams split the two games.
