Police warn
of narcotics
stolen from
new vet clinic

A newly-opened veterinary clinic in Oakville was the target of a robbery the first week of January as an unknown number of suspects made off with potentially harmful narcotics, including one that has been used as a date rape drug, Halton police say.

“When narcotics fall into the wrong hands and are misused, they can be extremely dangerous, even deadly. Please be cautious about what you are ingesting and for what reasons,” said Halton police Sgt. Chantal Corner.

The incident occurred some time between 3 p.m. on Monday, Jan. 5 and 5 a.m., Tuesday, Jan. 6 at the Oakville-Lakeshore Animal Hospital at 150 Lakeshore Rd.
