Local skiers win Canada Winter Games gold

Oakville skiers Brianna Macdonald and Robert Andison each won gold medals during the first week of competition at the Canada Winter Games in Victoria, B.C.

Macdonald dominated the women's alpine giant slalom, winning by nearly four seconds. The victory came a day after she earned silver in the super-G.

"I was going really fast and I felt myself increas-

ing speed on every single section of the course," said the 15-year-old. "I came down to the bottom and I was ahead of everyone by a lot, so I was really happy."

Andison's victory came in the men's freestyle dual moguls, where he bested Quebec's Alexandre Lavoie 19-16 in the final. Andison, 17, added a 10th-place

finish in single moguls.

Oakville's William Kornya also earned a skiing medal, collecting bronze in the men's alpine super-G. Griffin Copp, also of Oakville, was fourth in the event.

In women's hockey, Oakville's Lindsay Agnew, Madison Field, Sarah McDonnell and Kristin O'Neill were forced to settle for silver after a 2-1 overtime loss to Quebec in the cham-

pionship game. O'Neill forced OT by tying the game with 3:20 remaining in regulation time, but Quebec scored a power-play marker 9:18 into the extra session to win its first-ever Canada Winter Games women's hockey title.

The Games will continue until March 1.

Curler claims eighth U.S. title

Since her first USA Curling Nationals in 1991, Erika Brown has changed roles, teammates, even the country where she lives.

The only thing that hasn't changed is her ability to win.

The Oakville resident won her eighth national title Saturday in Kalamazoo, Mich., holding off a late charge by former teammate Patti Lank to win 7-6. Brown now ranks second to Allison

Pottinger (10) in U.S. women's titles. The victory came 20 years after Brown's first national women's title

in 1995, the first of her only backto-back wins. She added championships in 1999, 2002 and 2004 (all three as vice with Lank as skip).

Brown ended her longest stretch without a championship – six years — when she took the 2010 title,
