

Coyotes hoping to turn it around for playoffs

Time to pop the cork on the champagne! Hardly, but the **Oakville Coyotes junior A roller hockey team** played three games this past week and won two — a first for this season.

Behind solid goaltending of Frank Doyle and Ryan Miehm the Coyotes won 12-9 in Brampton Sunday and 7-6 in Vaughan.

Sunday afternoon also marked the first of many junior 'A' games for a pair of bantam call-ups Kelly Vieth and Alex Pryde who showed they are ready to make the jump to junior. Both played strong games with Pryde picking up a pair of crucial assists late in the game.

"These two have great hands and foot speed," noted Jay Labelle. "You could not help but appreciate the future of the team today, after watching these guys play."
