Halton 13U Hurricanes tops \$\frac{1}{2}\$ division at 14U provincials

The Halton Hurricanes' 13-and-under Black team played up an age group and still managed to come out on top.

The Blacks won the 14U Division 3 provincial volleyball championship in Waterloo earlier this month.

The Hurricanes were the No. 3 seed in the division and beat the North Bay Lakers 25-17, 25-14 in the semifinals.

The Hurricanes advanced to the final against the Cambridge Scorpions, winning 25-9, 25-11.

To bring home the gold medal, Hurricanes went undefeated in all nine matches over the three days.
