The Q.E. Park junior team had been putting together good results all season and were gunning for gold.

They won the combined G-HAC/Halton championship as well as winning all three Ontario tournaments they entered, in Bishop Reding, Iona and Heartlake. In the latter two, they won the team title over St. Michael's.

They went to a U.S. tournament in Rochester and settled

"We are happy," said coach Bryan Camani.

On the girls' side, there were a couple of top 15 finishes with Q.E. Park's Courtney Kirkby finishing 13th in junior women's and White Oaks' Kathryn Matheson finishing 14th in midget girls.

To put it in perspective, noted Camani, imagine if a hockey player was rated in the top 15 in the province: "it's a huge achievement."




