

THE BALLOON "ATLANTIC."

INTERESTING ADVENTURES ABOVE LAKE ONTARIO.

From the Buffalo Courier. The balloon "Atlantic" was seen on Saturday, (the 2nd) about noon, by Mr. A. Murray, at Port Dalhousie, passing east.

"The monster balloon 'Atlantic' left St. Louis at twenty minutes past seven on Friday evening, and took a course almost due east towards the eastern seaboard.

"This balloon is one of the largest ever constructed, being 130 feet in length from top to bottom, and 60 feet in diameter, with a lifting capacity of some 10,000 or 12,000 pounds.

"They immediately arose to an altitude of about two miles which was the highest point gained during the trip. Here they found the easterly current expected, and sailed along at the rate of about a mile per minute.

ACCIDENT TO THE PLOUGHBOY.

A MAN ARRESTED FOR A MURDER COMMITTED TWENTY-FOUR YEARS AGO.

It seems that a little over twenty-four years ago, a man named C. B. Irey, residing in Roane county, East Tennessee, conceived a dislike to a sister-in-law residing in that county, and murdered her in a deliberate and cold-blooded manner.

Shortly after his incarceration in gaol, however, he effected his escape, and made his way to Arkansas, where he settled on the Arkansas River, and resided up to within a few weeks past.

A Dutch paper makes us acquainted with a branch of commerce of the existence of which we were not previously aware, namely young foxes. It is stated that in the course of the last three weeks 66 cubs have been sent from Bergen Zoo, to be shipped at Rotterdam for England.

The Gazette notifies that the Hon. W. Elliott has been appointed to proceed to Naples, on a special mission to convey her Majesty's congratulations to the King of the two Sicilies on his accession to the throne.

The patent which secures to her Majesty's printers the sole right of printing the Bible in England, expires in the next year. Strenuous efforts will be made to prevent a renewal of this monopoly, and thus place England on the same footing as Scotland.

Accounts from Rio Janeiro state that President General Urquiza threatens seriously to invade Buenos Ayres, and has collected 20,000 men. The provinces of the Argentine Confederation show their approbation of the war by public demonstrations.

The Cologne Gazette states that the Prince of Wales assured the Pope that the Queen took the deepest interest in the situation of the States of the Church.
