

A Letter in the "Christia Guardian" from New Columbia, dated August 24th, mentions that Mr. John Ramage, a son of Mr. Ramage of Kingston, C. W., who occupies the prominent position of President of the City Council of New Westminster in New Columbia, had a narrow escape from death by an explosion of the boiler of the steamer "Cariboo" on which he was a passenger from Victoria. The explosion occurred in the dead of the night, while the passengers were asleep, and the first intimation Mr. Ramage had of the disaster was finding himself in the water surrounded by fragments of the wreck. Only five of the passengers and crew of the steamer were saved, of whom Mr. Ramage was one.
